Round Five of the HRA Touring Championship

SUNDAY 15TH OCTOBER 2023

A Word from the Directing Team:

No special car preparations are required. All roads are easily passable by any normal passenger car.

The event is in two Sections:

Section 1 - The Novice Section:

Starting at 12.00 Noon for the first car and finishing at 2.00pm. Relatively simple navigation, some Via Points are marked and numbered on the supplied maps. Remember we don't want to get you lost, only to miss the occasional Via Point. We do, however, recommend a magnifying glass, compass, ruler and pencil be carried: a trip meter is of value. Those born after 1960 may also need a calculator.

Lunch Break:

There will be approximately a 1.5-hour break between Sections 1 and 2.

This will enable those who are competing in both Section 1 and Section 2 to have a break, and then plot Section 2.

Section 2 – The Experts Section:

This is a shorter and more difficult section. It uses largely older maps and will hopefully test even the most experienced competitors. However, again, we do not want you to get lost so we hope to take the occasional points off you on the way through. First car starts at 3.30 pm and is due to finish at 4.30 pm.

SAFETY:

Remember that you will be travelling on public roads. You must obey all Road Laws including Speed Limits. Please be courteous to all other road users and give way to everyone. If you are looking for something pull well off to the left and watch your mirrors.

1. THE EVENT

The Event shall be known as the **2023 Dandenongs Touring Assembly**, hereafter referred to as "The Event" and will be run as a club Touring Assembly over public roads during daylight hours on 15th October 2023.

The Event shall be in two parts. Firstly a Novice Event comprising Section 1 only and secondly a combined Section 1 and Section 2. These will be scored for the overall Event.

2. AUTHORITY

The Event will be conducted under the provision of the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, The National Competition Rules (NCR) of Motorsport Australia, and the parts of the National Touring Standing Regulations referring to Touring Assemblies. The NTSR is available on the Motorsport Australia website at: National Touring Standing Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations, Instructions, or Route Instructions which may be issued.

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.

The Motorsport Australia Permit Number 323/1510/03 will be on display at the start.

5. CREW ELIGIBILITY

- 5.1 No special licence is required to compete in this event.
- 5.2 The driver of the vehicle must hold a current and valid civil drivers licence.
- 5.3 To enter and be eligible for points towards the HRA Touring Championship; driver and/or nominated navigator must be current financial members of the HRA.
- 5.4 Extra passengers up to the vehicle's legal seating capacity may be carried. In this case a Disclaimer must be completed for each additional passenger and submitted with the entry form.
- 5.5 Motorsport Australia Personal Insurance is provided for all current financial members of a club affiliated with Motorsport Australia in Victoria. As this is a Touring Assembly event on public roads those without a Club Licence are covered by their normal Traffic Accident Commission (TAC) insurance.

6. VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY and SCRUTINY

- 6.1 All competing vehicles must be registered or have a permit allowing the vehicle to be driven on public roads in the State of Victoria.
- 6.2 All vehicles may be checked for general roadworthiness and must be equipped with a seat belt for every vehicle occupant. If, in the opinion of officials at the start or break, a vehicle is unsafe to compete, permission will not be granted for that entry to continue.
- 6.3 A Motorsport Australia Statement of Vehicle Compliance Form may be required with entry.

7. ENTRIES

7.1 The entry fee for the Event shall be in two parts:

Section 1 (Novice) only \$55.00

Section 1 (Novice) and Section 2 (Experts) total \$75.00

7.2 Preferred payment is by Electronic Funds Transfer:

If you pay your entry fee by EFT you MUST print and attach a copy of the transaction receipt to the completed entry form.

- 7.4 The following documents are required to be produced either when booking in at the Start Control or (preferably) delivered electronically prior to the Event to the above email
 - Current Registration Certificate or Permit for the competing vehicle.
 - Current driver's licence for all those likely to be driving during the Event.
 - Proof of current car club membership for those competing in the HRA Touring Championship.
- 7.5 Entries must be on the official entry form and be complete and correct in every detail. Competitors who are contesting the HRA Touring Championship must indicate this by marking the appropriate box on the entry form.
- 7.6 The field for the event shall be limited to forty (40) cars to be determined in order of receipt of entry. Entries may be refused in accordance with the NCR.

8. STARTING ORDER

Vehicles will start in order of entry, as determined by the Assistant COC, the first car departing at 12.01pm with subsequent cars leaving at 1 minute intervals.

9. EVENT RUNNING DETAILS

- 9.1 The Event will start at Fonzies Diner, 93 Canterbury Rd, Kilsyth VIC 3137 with part way break (Novice Section end) and event overall finish at a venue East of Melbourne.
- 9.2 Book-in will be available from 10.30 am. The diner will open at 10.30 am. Route instructions for Section 1 will be available to competitors after book-in. First car to start at 12.01 pm
- 9.3 The total distance is approx. 75km and any change(s) to distance or time allowed for the event will be advised in Route Instructions.
- 9.4 The Finish Controls will close at a specific time for each competitor. Any competitor arriving later than 15 minutes after their due time will not be eligible for bonus points.
- 9.5 The first car is expected to arrive at the lunch break at 2.00pm. Instructions for Section 2 will be available from 2.00pm.
- 9.6 The first car will start Section 2 at 3.31pm
- 9.7 The first car is expected to arrive at the finish at 4.30pm
- 9.8 There will be no crew briefing, any relevant information will be included with the Route Instructions.
- 9.9 <u>ALL</u> Civil Road Regulations must be obeyed throughout the Event. All Event Officials are Judges of Fact in relation to competitor's behaviour during the Event.

10. OFFICIAL MAPS

The official maps for the event will be supplied by the Organisers. These maps (and Instructions) will feature Imperial Measurements. No other maps (including street directories) may be carried. GPS devices and mobile phones with GPS capabilities are technically not permitted. The Organisers accept that it is not always possible to disable these devices but expect competitors to observe the spirit of the event and not use them. Besides, modern GPS maps may not bear any relationship to the specified maps!

11. CONTROLS

Major Controls will be marked by an "M" board

Manned Passage Controls will be marked by a "P" board. At a manned passage competitors are required to stop each time such a location is entered and the official will make a notation on the competitors road card.

Information may be required to be noted at specified Via points or at any location along the route that the instructions may require a crew to visit. This may include specific sections of road.

At any Via Point during the Event, competitors may find any or some of the following:

- Nothing
- Information Board (examples in Route Instructions)
- Redirection Board (examples in Route Instructions)
- Manned Passage Control
- Answers to Prescribed Question(s) eg. Road Name or Signpost

Observers may be at any point on the course to note any infringements of traffic laws.

Speeding will not be tolerated and will be penalised by exclusion from the event.

12. SCORING AND PENALTIES

Scoring will be as follows:

- Correct information +10 Points - Incorrect or missing Information Nothing - Manned Passage - correct direction +20 Points - Manned Passage - Incorrect direction +10 Points - Manned Passage - missed **Nothing** - Arrival at Major Control within due time +200 Points - Arrival at Major Control within 5 minutes after due time +160 Points - Arrival at Major Control within 10 minutes of due time +120 Points - Arrival at Major Control within 15 minutes of due time +80 Points - Arrival at Major Control outside 15 minutes of due time Nothing - Entering "Out of Bounds" area - 20 Points - Recording "Dummy" information -10 Points - Detected breaches of Traffic Regulations Exclusion

13. AWARDS

1st Novice Crew

1stOverall Crew

1st Rookie Crew

Notes:

- 1. The Clerk of the Course will decide eligibility for all awards with reference to the HRA Grading List.
- 2. Further awards may be made. Any such awards will be detailed with Final Results
- 3. The Clerk of the Course or his Assistant may grade crews at his discretion.
- 4. Protests must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.

14. JUDGES OF FACT

All control officials and observers designated by the Clerk of the Course are deemed to be Judges of Fact for the following:

- Time and direction of entry and exit at their control.
- Detected breaches of Traffic Regulations
- Roadworthiness of Vehicles

14. POSTPONEMENT, ABANDONMENT, CANCELLATION

The Organiser reserves the right to abandon, postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR or if, in their opinion, the entries are insufficient or by "Force Majeure."

15.INTEGRITY, ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and "vaping") and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refuelling/defueling operation.

Motorsport Australia's National Integrity Framework and any associated policy (including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy. Motorsport Australia's Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy), apply to any activity authorised by Motorsport Australia as published at www.motorsport.org.au. Any Participant including the holder of a Motorsport Australia Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia. Consumption of alcohol in any Reserved Area is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

16. CONTRACTORS

No paid or unpaid contractors are used in this Event.

17. OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY (OH&S) POLICY

The Event is to be held in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1st, Integrity and Legal, and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au.

Due to the moving nature of the Event, the OH&S Policy will not be viewable during the Event. It is a requirement of Competitors that prior to the Event Start, all Competitors and Officials make themselves aware of Motorsport Australia OH&S requirements.

A Medical Response Plan is not applicable. A First Aider will be in attendance at the start / finish location. All competitors are advised that Ambulance cover is advisable. In the event of an emergency requiring a medical response the use of mobile phones is encouraged. Emergency contact numbers will be made available in Route Instructions.

Given the moving nature of the Event, it is not practicable to hold a separate briefing/site induction prior to the Start. Any changes or alterations to these Supplementary Regulations will be advised in Further Regulations.

RISK WARNING, DISCLAIMER AND INDEMNITY

Motorsport Activities are inherently dangerous recreational activities and there is significant risk of injury, disability or death. If you do not wish to be exposed to such risks, then you should not participate in the Motorsport Activities. Acknowledgement of Risks

I acknowledge that the risks associated with attending or participating in Motorsport Activities include but are **not limited** to the risk that I may suffer harm as a result of:

- motor vehicles (or parts of them) colliding with other motor vehicles or persons or property;
- other participants acting dangerously or with lack of skills;
- high levels of noise exposure;
- acts of violence and other harmful acts (whether intentional or inadvertent) committed by persons attending or participating in the event; and
- the failure or unsuitability of facilities (including grand-stands, fences and guard rails) to ensure my safety.

Exclusion of Liability, Release and Indemnity

In exchange for being able to attend or participate in the Motorsport Activities, I will and agree to:

- to release Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the extent that any or all of them are providing Recreational Services from all liability for:
- my death:
- any physical or mental injury (including the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of such an injury);
- the contraction, aggravation or acceleration of a disease including but not only COVID-19;
- the coming into existence, the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of any other condition, circumstance, occurrence, activity, form of behaviour, course of conduct or

state of affairs:

- that is or may be harmful or disadvantageous to me or the community; or
- that may result in harm or disadvantage to me or the community,
- any claim for any costs and expenses I may incur as a consequence of any of the above; arising from my participation in or attendance at the Motorsport Activities;
- to indemnify and hold harmless and keep indemnified Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the maximum extent permitted by law in respect of any Claim by any person; and
- to attend at or participate in the Motorsport Activities at my own risk.

I understand that:

- nothing in this document excludes, restricts or modifies any rights that I may have as a result of significant personal injury that is caused by the Reckless Conduct of Motorsport Australia and the Entities as the supplier of the Motorsport Activities and Recreational Services;
- nothing in this document prevents Motorsport Australia and the Entities from relying on any laws (including statute and common law) that limit or preclude their liability;
- nothing in this document excludes any term or guarantee which under statute cannot be excluded, however the liability of Motorsport Australia

and the Entities is limited to the minimum liability allowable by law;

- nothing in this document precludes me from making a claim under a Motorsport Australia insurance policy where I am expressly entitled to make a claim under that insurance policy; and
- Motorsport Australia has arranged for limited personal injury insurance coverage which may provide me with some protection for loss, damage or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motorsport Activities. I acknowledge and accept that the insurance taken out by Motorsport Australia may not provide me with full indemnity for loss, damage or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motorsport Activities, and that I may have to pay the excess if a Claim is made under an insurance policy on my behalf. I agree that

my own insurance arrangements are ultimately my responsibility and I will arrange any additional coverage at my expense after taking into account Motorsport Australia's insurance arrangements, this document and my own circumstances.

Where Motorsport Activities are held in the following jurisdictions, I acknowledge that I have also read and accept the following warnings:

Under Australian Government Consumer Law (which is part of the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Commonwealth)), several guarantees are implied into contracts for the supply

of certain goods and services. I agree that the application of all or any of the provisions of Subdivision B of Division 1 of Part 3-2 of Australian Consumer Law (i.e. guarantees relating to the supply of services), the exercise of rights conferred by those provisions, and any liability of Motorsport Australia and the Entities for a failure to comply with any such guarantees, are excluded. However, such exclusion is limited to liability for:

- death, physical or mental injury (including aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of such an injury of the individual);
- contraction, aggravation or acceleration of a disease of an individual; or

Warning Applicable in Relation to Motorsport Activities Held in Victoria

Warning Under The Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012:

Under **The Australian Consumer Law (Victoria)**, several statutory guarantees apply to the supply of certain goods and services. These guarantees mean that the supplier named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to me:

- are rendered with due care and skill;
- are reasonably fit for any purpose which I either expressly or by implication, make known to the supplier; and
- might reasonably be expected to achieve any result I have made known to the supplier.

Under section 22 of the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012 (Vic), the supplier is entitled to ask me to agree that these conditions do not apply to me. I understand that if I sign this form, I am agreeing that any rights to sue the supplier under the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012 if I am killed or injured because the services were not in accordance with these guarantees, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.

Note: I note that the change to my rights, as set out in this form, does not apply if my death or injury is due to gross negligence on the supplier's part.

"Gross negligence" in relation to an act or omission, means doing the act or omitting to do an act with reckless disregard, with or without consciousness, for the consequences of the act or omission. See regulation 5 of the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Regulations 2012 and section 22(3)(b) of the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012.

Warning Applicable in Relation to Motorsport Activities Held in South Australia.

Under sections 60 and 61 of **The Australian Consumer Law (SA)**, if a person in trade or commerce supplies me with services (including recreational services), there is a statutory guarantee that those services:

- will be rendered with due care and skill; and
- any product resulting from those services, will be reasonably fit for the purpose for which the services are being acquired (as long as that purpose is made known to the supplier); and
- any product resulting from those services, will be of such a nature, and quality, state or condition, that they might reasonably be expected to achieve the result that the consumer wishes to achieve, (as long as that wish is made known to the supplier or a person with whom negotiations have been conducted in relation to the acquisition of the services.

Excluding, Restricting or Modifying My Rights:

Under section 42 of the Fair Trading Act 1987 (SA), the supplier of recreational services is entitled to ask me to agree to exclude, restrict or modify their liability for any personal injury suffered by me or another person for whom, or on whose behalf, I am acquiring the services (a third party consumer). If I sign this form, I am agreeing to exclude, restrict or modify the supplier's liability with the result that compensation may not be payable if I or the third party consumer suffer personal injury.

Important:

I do not have to agree to exclude, restrict or modify my rights by signing this form. The supplier may refuse to provide me with the services if I do not agree to exclude, restrict or modify my rights by signing this form. Even if I sign this form, I may still have further legal rights against the supplier. A child under the age of 18 cannot legally agree to exclude, restrict or modify their rights. A parent or guardian of a child who acquires recreational services for the child cannot legally agree to exclude, restrict or modify the child's rights.

Agreement to exclude, restrict or modify my rights:

I agree that the liability of Motorsport Australia and the Entities for any death or personal injury that may result from the supply of the recreational services that may be suffered by me (or a person for whom or on whose behalf I am acquiring the services) is excluded. Further information about these rights can be found at www.cbs.sa.gov.au

Definitions:

- a. "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand or cause of action however arising including but not limited to negligence, BUT does NOT include a claim under
- a Motorsport Australia insurance policy by any person expressly entitled to make a claim under that insurance policy;
- b. "Entities" means event and competition organisers/promoters/managers, land and track owners/managers/administrators/lessees, Motorsport Australia affiliated clubs, state and territory governments and insureds listed in Motorsport Australia's public/product/professional indemnity insurance policies and each of their related bodies corporate (including their related bodies corporate) and each of their organs and agencies, officers/president/directors/executives, employees, servants, agents, partners, providers, members, competitors, drivers, co-drivers, navigators, officials, crew members, service crew, delegates, licence holders, representatives, commissions, committees, advisers, trustees, councils, panels, shareholders, volunteers, officials, appointees, delegated bodies and sponsors;
- c. "Motorsport Activities" means any motorsport activities or Recreational Services which are permitted or approved which Motorsport Australia regulates or administers or otherwise are under the responsibility / control of Motorsport Australia;
- d. "Motorsport Australia" means the Confederation of Australia Motor Sport Ltd. trading as Motorsport Australia;
- e. "Reckless Conduct" means conduct where the supplier of the recreational services is aware, or should reasonably have been aware, of a significant risk that the conduct could result in personal injury to another person and engages in the conduct despite the risk and without adequate justification;
- f. "Recreational Services" means (unless otherwise defined in this document) services that consist of participation in:
- a. a sporting activity; or
- b. a similar leisure time pursuit or any other activity that:
- i. involves a significant degree of physical exertion or physical risk; and
- ii. is undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure.

DECLARATION

Any person making a false declaration is liable to refusal and cancellation of licence and/or insurance cover and/or entry to a motorsport activity I accept the conditions of, and acknowledge the risks arising from, attending or participating in motorsport activities being provided by Motorsport Australia and the Entities. I agree to be bound by the rules, regulations and policies of Motorsport Australia at all times. The information I have entered into this form is true and correct and I will advise Motorsport Australia immediately if any of the information I have given is no longer true and correct. I have read, understood, acknowledge and agree to the above including the exclusion of statutory guarantees, warning, assumption of risk, release and indemnity.
